THE HISTORY OF AUGUSTA PARTNERSHIP FOR CHILDREN, INC.

Augusta Partnership for Children, Inc. was established in 1985 as the Augusta Coalition for Children and Youth, and renamed in 2006 as the Augusta Partnership for Children, Inc. (APC). APC's history is simple, a group of local do-gooders concerned about the health and well-being of children and families related to teen pregnancies, juvenile arrests, poverty, etc. Their work eventually led to an invitation from Governor Zell Miller in 1991 to participate in a collaborative venture –The Family Connection Partnership of Georgia - on behalf of children and families.

This venture was to be funded by the Joseph B. Whitehead Foundation. As partners were added to the process, the Family Connection was able to expand its service area and the number of children and families served. Since its inception, APC has grown from nine partners to over 80 partner and stakeholder agencies representing business, government, non-profit, health, faithbased, school-based, and community-based agencies.

Today, we are proud to serve as the local partner for the state-wide network known as the Georgia Family Connection Partnership. This unique network brings together more than 3,000 local-and state-level partners in all 159 counties across Georgia who work toward measurably better outcomes for our state's children, families, and communities. Georgia Family Connection is the only statewide network in the country dedicated to the health and well-being of families and communities.
